This is a picture of George O. Anderson, (Captain in the 403rd BS) Lieutenant Colonel USAF, (Ret). He flew, as a WW11 B-24 pilot (aircraft commander), in the 403rd Bomb Squadron of the 43rd Bomb Group - 5th Air Force, from April 1944 to August 1945, with additional duty assignments as a flight test and assistant engineering officer. He flew 52 combat missions from New Guinea to Japan.

After WW11, he served in both the Korean and Vietnam wars. During his career, he served in various Command and staff positions at Air Force Headquarters, 5th Air Force headquarters and several Air Force bases where he was a commander at both Group and Squadron level. He flew various types of aircraft, powered by four, twin, and single engines, including a single engine jet. He retired in June 1971. He was born in Cranford, New Jersey.
